A unique opportunity to join us for a very special event. 2026 is 85 years since the first British RAF cadets were sent across the Atlantic to train as pilots and earn their 'Wings' before returning to Britain to play their part in the Allied War effort. Over 10,000 RAF pilots were trained in this way during 1941-45. Very few of those who were alive at that time are still around to remember these days. However we are now inviting all family, descendants and friends of those pilots who trained in the USA at any of the seven British Flying Training Schools (BFTS) or the Arnold Scheme to join us to share our memories of these brave young men. A rare opportunity to meet with others like you who wish to honour their memory.

Outline Programme (full details will be available when finalised)

Friday 2nd October: Arrival in Edinburgh. Optional dinner at hotel at your own expense.

Saturday 3rd October: After breakfast at the hotel, at **10.00am** you will be taken on a trip by coach to the **Scottish National Museum of Flight**, East Fortune Airfield, East Lothian. The visit includes:

- A visit to the 'Concorde' Hangar which starts with a group photo to be taken on the Concorde steps.
- Lunch at the Aviator Café (soup, sandwiches, traybakes and tea/coffee included).
- After lunch a talk by an aircraft conservator in the Conservation Hangar.
- Time at leisure to explore the rest of the airfield and its other Hangars.

These include many historic military and civilian aircraft, indoor and outdoor displays and a gift shop.

- After that we will board the coach around **3.00pm** for the trip back to the hotel.

All museum entry fees, coach travel and lunches are included in the price for the event.

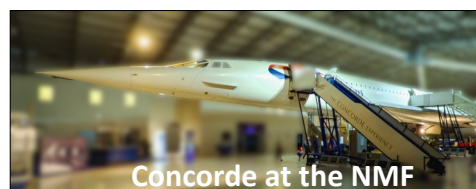

- **10.45 a.m.** 'Show and Tell' - a chance for delegates to show off mementoes and tell their stories.
- **12.30 p.m.** A finger buffet Lunch will be served in the Hermiston Suite
- Also there will be many interesting displays, books, exhibits and possibly slideshows for all to see.
- **1.00 pm** Finish - until next time

Venue details - Novotel Hotel, Edinburgh Park

Transport to/from the hotel:

By Tram: close to the **Edinburgh Park Tram stop**. Frequent trams run to/from Edinburgh Airport and Edinburgh City Centre (all stops).

By Rail: close to the **Edinburgh Park Rail Station**. Frequent trains to/from Edinburgh Waverley and Haymarket Stations. Also trains to various other destinations including Glasgow, Stirling and Dunblane.
